AMENDMENT TO THE DECLARATION OF COVENANTS, CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS FOR VILLAGES OF SUMTER BONITAVILLAS

a Subdivision in Sumter County according to the Plat thereof as recorded in Plat Book 8, Pages 39 through 39A, Public Records of Sumter County, Florida.

RECITALS

On April 13, 2006, The Villages of Lake-Sumter, Inc., as Declarant, recorded in Official Records Book 1561, Page 335 (2006-12673), Public Records of Sumter County, Florida, a DECLARATION OF COVENANTS, CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS for the subdivision known as VILLAGES OF SUMTER BONITA VILLAS, according to the plat recorded in Plat Book 8, Pages 39 through 39A, Public Records of Sumter County, Florida ("Declaration").

At this time, pursuant to the rights reserved in Article XI, Section 4 of the Declaration, Declarant hereby amends the Declaration.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Declaration is amended as follows:

The Declaration is amended by deleting Article V, Section 8 in its entirety and replacing it with the following:

"Section 8. No outbuilding, tent, shack, garage, trailer, shed, utility building or temporary building of any kind shall be erected, except temporarily only for construction purposes. Clear (non-colored) concrete and driveway coatings are permitted. No colored coatings are permitted without the prior written consent of Declarant, its designee, or an architectural review committee appointed by Declarant or Declarant's designee."

DECLARATION OF COVENANTS, CONDITIONS

For the purpose of enhancing and protecting the value, attractiveness and deshability of the lots or tracts constituting such subdivision, Declarant hereby declares that all of the Homesites (as hereinafter defined), and each part thereof, but not the tracts within the Subdivision, shall be held, sold, and conveyed only subject to the following easements, covenants, conditions, and restrictions, which shall constitute covenants running with the land and shall be binding on all parties having any right, title, or intenset in the above described property or any part thereat, their heirs, successors, and assigns, and shall intro to the benefit of each owner thereof.

ARTICLE L DEFINITIONS

- Section I. "Declarant" shall mean THE VILLAGES OF LAKE-SUMTER, INC. and its successors and assigns.
- Section 2. "District" shall mean the Village Community Development District No. 7, a community development district created pursuent to Chapter 190, Florida Staintes.
- Section 3. "Homestin" shall mean any plot of land shown upon the Plat which bears a numerical designation, but shall not include the tracts or other areas not intended for a residence.
- Section 4. "Institutional First Mortgage" shall mean a mortgage upon a Homesite and the improvements thereon granted to an owner by a bank, savings and loan association, pension fund, trust, real estate investment, insurance company or any other federally insured investment or financial institution.
- Section 5. "Maintenance" shall mean the exercise of reasonable care and repair to keep buildings, reads, landscaping, lighting, lawns, walls, fences, water and sewer distribution systems, storm water run off collection systems, and other related improvements and fixtures in good repair and condition. Maintenance of landscaping shall further mean the exercise of generally accepted garden-management practices necessary to promote a healthy, weed-free covironment for optimum plant growth.
 - Section 6. "Mortgage" shall mean a conventional mortgage.
- Section 7. "Owner" shall mean the record owner, whether one or more persons or entities, of a fee simple title to any Homesite which is a part of the Subdivision, and shall include contract solicus, but shall not include those holding title merely as security for performance of an obligation.
- Section 8. "Subdivision" shall mean the subdivided real property hereinbofore described and such additions thereto as may be brought within the jurisdiction of these restrictions as hereinafter provided.

ARTICLE IL THE DISTRICT

- Section 1. Services Provided by the District. The District shall have such authority and perform those services consistent with Chapter 190 of the Florida Statutes. Services shall include, but not be limited to the following:
- (a) Maintenance and repair of the reserved areas held by the District or dedicated to the use and enjoyment of the residents of the District, the Subdivision or the public;
- (b) Water, sewer, garbage, electrical, lighting, telephone, gas and other necessary utility service for the dedicated or reserved areas;
 - (c) Maintenance and repair to roads within the Subdivision;
- (d) Maintenance and repair of the storm water runoff drainage system including drainage casements and drain pipes.

- (e) Maintenance and repair to the top and exterior of the accurity wall fences, running along the sestem side of Homesite 1, and the rear of Homesites 55 through 61, unless such maintenance obligation is otherwise assumed by the adjaining land owner.
- (f) Maintenance and repair to that portion of the fence abutting and facing the tract within the Subdivision reserved for temporary vehicular parking.
- Section 2. District Assessments. The District shall have the enthority to impose assessments pursuent to the authority granted under Cimpter 190 of the Florida Statutes.
- Section 3. No Maintenance by Sumter County. No maintenance services on the readways, drainage easements, drain pipes, or any other maintenance services within the Subdivision will be performed by county government of Sumter County, Florida.

ARTICLE IIL THE VILLAGES CONTRACTUAL AMENITIES FEE

Each Owner hereby agrees to pay a monthly fee or charge (the "Contractual Amenities Fee") against each Homesite for the benefit and use of the recreational and other amenities, in the amount per month set forth in such Owner's Deed. The Contractual Amerities Fee set forth is limited to the Owner named therein. In the event the Owner(a) transfers, assigns or in any way conveys their interest in and to the Homesite, the new Owner(a) shall be obligated to pay the prevalent Contractual Amenities Fee sum that is then in force and effect for new Owner(s) of Homesites in the most recent addition or unit. The monthly Contractual Amenities Fee as set forth in this section is based on the cost of living for the munth of sale as reflected in the Consumer Price Index, U.S. Average of Items and Food, published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the U.S. Department or Labor (the "Index"). The month of sale shall be the date of the Contract for Purchase of the Homesite. There shall be an annual adjustment in the monthly Contractual Amenities Foo. The adjustments shall be proportional to the percentage increase or decrease in the Index. Bach adjustment shall be in effect for the intervening one year period. Adjustments not used on any adjustment date may be made any time thereafter. Each Owner agrees that as additional facilities are requested by the Owner(s) of Homesins and the erection of such additional facilities is agreed to by the Doclarant, that upon a voin of one half (A) of the Owners requesting such additional facilities and the commencement of charges therefor, the monthly Contractual Amenities Fee provided for in this section shall be increased accordingly without the limitations set forth herein. For the purpose of all votes the Declarant shall be entitled to one (1) vote for each Homesite owned by the Declarant. The monthly charges shall be paid to the Declarant or its designate each month to insure the provision of the services being paid for. The monthly charges for services described in this section shall be due and payable to Declarant and said charges once in affect will continue month to month whether or not said Homesite is vacent. Owner does hereby give and great unto Declarant a continuing lien in the nature of a Mortgage upon the Homesite of the Owner superior to all other liens and consumbrances, except any Institutional First Mortgage. This lien shall be perfected by recording in the Public Records a notice of lien or similarly titled instrument and shall secure the payment of all monies due Declarant hereunder and may be fureclosed in a court of equity in the manner provided for the foreclosures of mortgages. In any such action or any other action to enforce the provision of this ilen, including appeals, Declarant shall be entitled to recover siturney's fees incurred by it, abstract bills and court costs. Owner together with Owner's being, successors and satigus, agree to take title subject to and be bound by, and pay the charge set forth herein and acceptance of the deed shall further signify approval of said charge as being reasonable and fair, taking into consideration the nature of Declarant's project, Declarant's investment in the recreational area, and in view of all the other benefits to be derived by the Owners as provided havein. Purchasers of Homesites further agree, by the acceptance of their deeds and the payment of the purchase price therefor, acknowledge that the purchase price was solely for the purchase of their Homesite or Romesites, and that the Owners, their hours, successors and assigns, do not have any right, title or claim or interest in and to the recreational, dedicated, or reserved great or security facilities contained therein or appurtenent therein, by reason of the purchase of their respective Homesites, it being specifically agreed that Declarant, its successors and assigns is the sole and exclusive Owner of the areas and facilities, and the Contractual Amenities Fee is a fee for services and is in no way adjusted according to the cost of providing those services.

ARTICLE IV, PROPERTY RIGHTS

Section 1. Reciprocal Essements. There shall exist reciprocal appartenant essements between adjacent Homesites and between Homesites and adjacent dedicated erreserved areas. Buch Homesite may be beth benefitted and bundened by side yard essements, drivoway essements, essements for ingress and egress, and essements for maintenance, as described below:

(a) Side Yard Easements.

- (1) Scope and Duration. There shall exist for the benefit and use of the dominant tenement side yard easements over and upon the servient tenement. The easements shall be perpoted and the holder of the dominant tenement shall have exclusive use of that portion of the servient tenement burdened by the side yard easement, except that the servient tenement aball retain the following rights;
 - (i) The Owner of the servicut tenement shall have the right at all reasonable times to enter upon the essentent area, including the right to cross over the dominant tenement for such entry, in order to perform work related to the use and maintenance of the servicut tenement. In exercising the right of

- entry upon the ensement area as provided for above, the Owner of the serviont tenement agrees to utilize reasonable care not to damage my landscaping or other items existing in the easement area.
- (ii) The servicest tenement shall have the right of drainage over, across and upon the essential area for water draining from the tool of any dwelling or structure upon the servicest tenement, the right to maintain caves and appartenances thereto and the portions of any dwelling structure upon the servicest tenement as originally constructed or as constructed pursuant beauty.
- (iii) The Owner of the dominant tenement shall not attach any object to a wall, fence or dwelling belonging to the servient tenement or disturb the grading of the easement area or otherwise act with respect to the easement area in any manner which would damage the services tenement.
- (2) Description of the Side Yard Essement. The side yard easement shall coined over that portion of the servicut tenement lying between the side Homesite lot line of the dominant tenement and the building wall and extending frace or wall located upon the adjacent servicut tenement as originally constructed by Declarant. The side yard easement will extend from the interior of the rear fence or wall to the exterior of the front gate frace or wall. The dominant tenement shall be responsible for maintenance of the side yard easement.
- (3) Homesites Affected by the Side Yard Easement. The side yard easement shall benefit and burden the following Homesites:
 - (i) Homeoine both burdened and benefitted by side yard casements shall be Homeoines 2 through 15, 18 through 21, 24 through 33, 36 through 43, 46 through 53 and 56 through 60.
 - (ii) Homesites burdened but not benefitted by side yard easements shall be Homesites 16, 17, 23, 44, 45 and 55.
 - (iii) Homesites benefitted but not burdened by side yard easements shall be Humesites 1, 22, 34, 35, 54 and 61.

(b) Driveway Essements.

- (1) Scope and Duration. There shall exist for the benefit and use of the dominant tenement a driveway easement over end upon the servient tenement. The driveway easement shall be perpetual and the holder of the dominant tenement shall have explusive use of that portion of the servient tenement burdened by the driveway easement except that the servient tenement shall retain the following rights:
 - (i) The Owner of the servient tenement shall have the right of ingress and egress over the driveway easement to access the Owner's side yard and the side yard easement benefitting the Homesite Owner.
 - (b) The Owner of the servient tenement shall have the right at all reasonable times to enter upon the easement area, including the right to cross over the dominant tenement for such entry, in order to perform work related to the use and maintenance of the servient tenement. In exercising the right of entry upon the easement area as provided for above, the Owner of the acroical tenement agrees to utilize reasonable care not to damage any landscaping or other items existing in the easement area.
 - (iii) The servient tenement shall have the right of drainage over, across and upon the easement area for water drainage from the roof of any dwelling or structure upon the servicut tenement, the right to maintain serves and appurtenences thereto and the portions of any dwelling structure upon the servicut tenement as originally constructed or as constructed pursuant hereto.
 - (iv) The Owner of the dominant tenement shall not attach any object to a wall or dwelling belonging to the servient tenement or disturb the grading of the casement area or otherwise act with respect to the easement area in any manner which would damage the servient tenement.
- (2) Description of the Driveway Basement. Beginning at a point where the side Homesite let line of the dominant transment intersects the driveway of the dominant transment; thence am along the side Homesite let line away from the readway to a point on the front gate fance or wall; thence along the front gate fance or wall to a point on the side wall of the servicul transment; thence along a line running along the side wall of the servicul transment towards the readway to a point where the line intersects the driveway of the dominant tenement; thence

along said driveway inward the readway to a point where the driveway intersects the front Homesite lot line of the servient tenement; thence along the front Homesite lot line of the servient tenement to a point where the front Homesite lot line of the dominant and servient tenements intersect; thence along the side Homesite lot line between the dominant and servient tenements to the point of beginning and close. The dominant tenement shall be responsible for landscaping and maintanance of the driveway exement.

- (3) Homesites Affected by Driveway Easements. The driveway casement shall benefit and burden the following Homesites:
 - (i) Homesites both burdened and benefitted by driveway easements shall be Homesites 2 through 15, 18 through 21, 24 through 33, 36 through 43, 46 through 53 and 56 through 60.
 - (fi) Homesites burdened but not benefitted by drivoway easements shall be Homesites 1, 22, 34, 35, 54 and 61.
 - . (iii) Homesites benefitied but not burdened by driveway casements shall be Homesites 16, 17, 23, 44, 45 and 55.
- (c) Ensement for Ingress and Egress. There shall exist for the benefit and use of the dominant tenement a perpetual examinat for ingress and egress over and upon the servient tenement for the limited purpose of allowing the dominant tenement to access his side yard and side yard examinat through the front gale fence wall.
- Section 2. Owner's Easements of Enjoyment in Dedicated or Reserved Areas. Every Owner of a Homesito shall have a right and easement of ingress and egress and enjoyment in and to the dedicated or reserved areas subject to limitations and conditions set forth in the dedications and restrictions found in the plat of Bonita Villas.
- Section 3. Easements of Encroschment. There shall exist reciprocal appurtment casements as between adjacent Homesites and between each Homesite and any portion or portions of reserved or dedicated areas adjacent thereto for any encroschment due to the nonwillful placement, settling, or shifting of the improvements constructed, reconstructed, or alteration is in accordance with the terms of this Declaration. Such easement shall exist to a distance of not more than one (1) foot as measured from any point on the common boundary between adjacent Homesites, and between each Homesite and any adjacent portion of the dedicated or reserved area. No easement for accordancent shall exist as to any encroachment occurring due to the willful conduct of an Owner. A certificate by Declarant recorded in the Public Records to the effect that an encroachment is not willful, shall be conclusive proof thereof.

Section 4. Other Easements.

- (a) Basements for installation and maintenance of underground utilities, cable television, sanitary and storm drainage facilities, landscaping and wall fencing, are hereby reserved over reserved or dedicated areas. Within these easements, no structure, planting, or other material shall be placed or permitted to remain which may damage or interfere with the installation and maintenance of utilities, or which may damage, interfere with, or change the direction of flow of drainage facilities in the easements. The casement area of each Homesite and all improvements therein shall be continuously maintained by the Owner of such Homesite, except for improvements for maintenance of which a public authority or utility company is responsible. Declarant contemplates constructing paties and similar improvements within such easements. Utility providers utilizing such easement area covenant, as a condition of the right to use such easement, not to interfere or disturb such equipment and improvements located within the easement area. In order to minimize damage to the property subject to such easement, utility providers are encouraged to install utilities pursuant to a Joint Treach Agreement. All utility providers are responsible for repairing the grading and landscape being disturbed pursuant to any utilization of such easements.
- (b) Basements for the installation and maintenance of wall and fencing and easements for the installation and maintenance of a storm water runoff drainage system are hereby reserved over a strip of land five feet (5) wide running along the rear Homesite let line of each Homesite in the Subdivision, together with that portion of each Homesite actually occupied by side fence walls and gate fence walls and the storm water runoff drainage system. Such easements along the rear Homesite let line shall also permit a community development district to enter upon such easements along the rear Homesite let line shall also permit a community development district to enter upon such easement area to maintain the security wall on the Homesite or the adjoining property. Basements for the installation and maintenance of utilities is hereby granted to the providers of those utilities over and upon a five (5) foot strip of land within each Homesite, running along the front Homesite let lines. Declarant reserves the right to remove, relocate, or reduce such easements lying along the front and rear let lines of the Homesite by recording in the Public Records of Suniter County, Florida, an amendment to this Declaration which is duly executed by the Declarant.
- (c) No dwelling unit or other structure of any kind other than the aforementioned walls or fences shall be built, erected, or maintained on any such easement, reservation, or right of way, except that paties and walls may be constructed over the easement reserved over the strip of land tunning along the back Homesite lot line of each Homesite. Equipment for pool or spa operation may be placed within the easement however. Such easements, reservations, and rights of way shall at all times be open and accessible to public and quari-public utility conjurations, their camployees and contractors, and shall also be open and accessible to Declarant, its successors and

assigns, all of whom shall have the right and privilege of doing whatever may be necessary in, on, under, and shove such locations to carry out any of the purposes for which such essentents, reservations, and rights of way are reserved.

Section 5. Right of Entry. The Declarant and the District, forcugh its duly authorized employees and contractors, shall have the right after reasonable notice to the Owner thereof, to enter any Homesite at any reasonable hour on any day to perform such maintenance as may be suftenized herein.

Section 6. No Partition. There shall be no judicial partition of dedicated or reserved areas, nor shall Deciment, or any Owner or any other person acquiring any interest in the Subdivision or any part thereof, seek judicial partition thereof. However nothing contained herein shall be construed to prevent judicial partition of any Homestie owned in co-tenancy.

ARTICLE V. USE RESTRICTIONS

The Subdivision shall be occupied and used only as follows:

Section 1. The Subdivision is an adult community designed to provide housing for persons 55 years of ago or older. All houses that are occupied must be occupied by at least one person who is at least fifty-five (55) years of age. No person under nineteen (19) years of age may be a permanent resident of a home, except that persons below the see of ninoteen (19) years may be permitted to visit and temperarily reside for periods not exceeding thirty (30) days in total in any calendar year period. The Declarant or its designee in its sole discretion shall have the right to establish hardship exceptions to permit individuals between the ages of nineteen (19) and fifty-five (55) to permanently reside in a home even through there is not a permanent resident in the home who is fifty-five (55) years of age or over, providing that said exceptions shall not be permitted in situations where the granting of a hardship exception would result in less than 80% of the Homesites in the Subdivision having less than one resident fifty-five (55) years of age or older, it being the intent that at least 80% of the units shall at all times have at least one resident lifty-five (55) years of age or older. The Declarant shall establish rules, regulations policies and procedures for the purpose of assuring that the foregoing required percentages of adult occupancy are maintained at all times. The Declarant or its designee shall have the sole and absolute authority to deny occupancy of a home by any person(s) who would thereby create a violation of the aforesald percentages of adult occupancy. Permanent occupancy or residency may be further defined in the Rules and Regulations of the Subdivision as may be promulgated by the Declarant or its designee from time to time. All residents shall certify from time to time as requested by the Declarant, the names and dates of birth of all occupants of a home,

Section 2. No business of any kind shall be conducted on any residence with the exception of the business of Declarant and the transferces of Declarant in devaloping and selling all of the Homesites as provided herein.

Section 3. No notious or officialive activity shall be excited on in or on any Homesite with the exception of the business of Declarant and the transferces of Declarant in developing all of the Homesites as provided herein.

Section 4. No sign of any kind shall be displayed to public view on a Homesite or any dedicated or reserved area without the prior written consent of the Declarant, except customary name and address rigns and one sign advertising a property for sale or rent which shall be no larger than twelve (12) inches wide and twelve (12) inches high and which shall be located wholly within the residence and only visible through a window of the residence. Lawn emances are prohibited, except for seasons displays not exceeding a thirty (30) day duration.

Section 5. Nothing shall be done or kept on a Homesile or on any dedicated or reserved area which would increase the rate of insurance relating thereto without the prior written consent of the Declarent, and no Owner shall pount anything to be done or kept on his Homesite or any dedicated or reserved area which would result in the cancellation of insurance on any residence or on any part of the dedicated or reserved area, or which would be in violation of any law.

Section 6. Birds, fish, dogs and cats shall be permitted, with a maximum of two (2) pets per Homesite. Each Owner shall be personally responsible for any desirence caused to any dedicated or reserved area by any such pet and shall be responsible to immediately remove and dispose of any excrement of such pet and shall be responsible to keep such pet on a leash. No other animals, livestock, or poultry of any kind shall be reised, kired, or keept on any Homesite or on any dedicated or reserved area.

Section 7. No fence, hedge, wall, or other dividing instrumentality shall be constructed or maintained on any Homesite, except that Declarant and the transferces of Declarant may construct fences in accordance with existing architectural plans. In order to maintain a visible roadway, no bush, shrub, tree, or other similar plant may be placed within the road right-of-way. No ingress or egress to or from any Homesite is permitted except pursuant to such driveways and sidewalks as originally constructed by Declarant.

Section 8. No outbuilding, tent, shack, garage, trailer, shad, utility building or temporary building of any kind shall be exceted, except temporarily only for construction purposes. Clear (non-colored) concrete and driveway cortings are permitted. No colored coating is permitted.

Section 9. Nothing shall be altered in, constructed on, or removed from any dedicated or reserved areas except on the written consent of the Declarant, after the original development fluoreof by the Declarant. Landscaping

maintenance in the dedicated or reserved areas shall be the duty of the District and no other person shall attempt to alter or maintain it.

- Section 10. The hanging of clothes or clotheslines or placing of clothes poles is prohibited to the extent allowed by law. No serials, satellite reception dishes, or extennes of any kind, nor window sir-conditioners or brigation wells are permitted within the Subdivision, except as specifically allowed by law. The location of any improved dovice will be as previously approved by the Declarant in writing.
- Section 11. Prior to being placed embedde for collection, no rubbish, trush, gurbage, or other waste material shall be kept or permitted on any Homesite or on dedicated or reserved areas except in sanitary containers located in appropriate areas concealed from public view.
- Section 12. Once placed curbride for collection, all garbage will be contained in plastic bags prescribed by Declarant and placed curbride no earlier than the day before scheduled plak-up. In the alternative, the Declarant shall have the right to require that garbage be placed in a dumpster and not placed curbride. In either event, all garbage must be contained in fully closed and scaled plastic bags prescribed by the Declarant. To Maintain the Subdivision in a clean and sanitory condition and to minimize heavy commercial traffic within the Subdivision, garbage and trash scrvice shall be provided by a camer selected by the Declarant, and charges paid separately by each Owner. Owner agrees that garbage and trash scrvice shall commence on the closing date the Owner purchases Owner's Homesin and home. Owner acknowledges that garbage and trash services is provided, and the fee for such service is payable, on a year-round basis regardless of use or occupancy. Declarant reserves the right to require all Owner's to participate in a curbeide recycling program if and when one is instituted.
- Section 13. Owner(s) shall use his property in such a manner as in allow his neighbors to enjoy the use of their property. Radios, record players, television, voices and other sounds are to be kept on a moderate level from 10:00 p.m. to one (i) hour before daylight. These restrictions shall not apply to construction noises being made by the Declarest.
- Section 14. The Declarant reserves the right to prohibit or control all pedaling, soliciting, selling, delivery and vehicular traffic within the Subdivision.
- Section 15. The Declarant reserves the right to establish such other ressousble rules and regulations covering the utilization of the Homesites by the Owner(s) in order to maintain the aesthetic qualities of this Subdivision, all of which apply equally to all of the parties in the Subdivision. The rules and regulations shall take effect within five (5) days from the sending of a potice to an Owner(s).
- Section 16. Individual malibores may not be located upon a Homesite. Malibexes are provided by the U.S. Postal Service at no cost to Owner, however, those boxes shall be housed by Declarant at a one time lifetime charge to Owner of \$190.00 per box. If tills to a Homesite is transferred, a new charge shall be made to the new Owner at the then prevailing mailbox fee being charged to new Owners of Homesites in the most recent addition or unit of the VILLAGES OF SUMTER. Payment of this fee shall be a condition collectible in the same manner as the maintenance fee and shall constitute a lim against the Homesite until it is paid. The mailbox fee may be increased in the same percentages and manner as increases in The Villages Contractual Amenities Pees.
- Section 17. Declarant or the transferrers of Declarant thall undertake the work of developing all Homesites included within the Subdivision. The completion of that work, and the sale, rental, or other disposition of regidential units is essential to the establishment and welfare of the Subdivision as an origining residential community. In order that such work may be completed and the Subdivision be established as a fully occupied residential community as soon as possible, nothing in title Declaration shall be understood or construed to:
- (a) Provent Declarant; Declarant's transferees, or the employees, contractors, or subcontractors of Declarant or Declarant's transferees from during on any part or parts of the Subdivision owned or controlled by Declarant or Declarant's transferees or their representatives, whatever they determine may be reasonably necessary or advisable in connection with the completion of such work;
- (b) Prevent Declarant, Declarant's transferees, or the employees, contractors, or subcontractors of Declarant or Declarant's transferees from constructing and maintaining on any part or parts of the Subdivision property owned or combolled by Declarant's transferees, or their representatives such structures as may be reasonably necessary for the completion of such work, the establishment of the Subdivision as a residential community, and the disposition of Homesites by sole, lease, or otherwise;
- (c) Prevent Declarant, Declarant's transferees, or the employees, contractors, or subcontractors of Declarant or Declarant's transferees from conducting on any part or parts of the Subdivision property owned or controlled by Declarant or Declarant's transferees or their representatives, the business of completing such work, of establishing the Subdivision as a residential community, and of disposing of Homerites by sale, lease, or otherwise; or
- (d) Prevent Declarant, Declarant's transferees, or the employees, contractors, or subcontractors of Declarant or Declarant's transferees from maintaining such sign or signs on any of the Homesites owned or controlled by any of them as may be necessary in connection with the sale, lease or other disposition of subdivision Homesites.

As used in this section, the words "its transferees" specifically exclude purchasers of Homesties improved with completed residences.

Section 18. No unauthorized person may enter outs any wildlife preserve set forth within the areas designated as such in the Development Order entered into in connection with the Villages of Sunter, a Development of Regional Impact, or as it may be amended from time to time. Each Owner shall ensure that any construction on the Homesite complies with the construction plans for the surface water management system pursuant to Chapter 40D-4, F.A.C., approved and on tile with the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD). No Owner of the property within the Subdivision may construct or maintain any trailding, residence, or structure, or undertaken or perform any activity in the wetlands, buffer areas, and upland conservation areas described in the approved parmit and recorded plat of the Subdivision, unless prior approved is received from the District pursuant to Chapter 40D-4, R.A.C.

Section 19. Except as originally constructed by the Declarant, no driveways, walkways, cartpaths or access shall be located on or permitted on any road right-of-way, walkway or cartpath.

Section 20. Temporary parking depicted on the plat of the Subdivision is not for Owner's use but is for the use of Owner's invitees and guests.

ARTICLE YL WATER RESOURCES

Water Resources. In order to preserve, conserve and efficiently utilize precious water resources, all Homes within the Subdivision have been designed and constructed with two completely separate water systems. One system provides at deliging intention water and the other system provides potable water for drinking and all other uses.

- Section 1. Potable water and wastewater utility systems. All Homes will contain modern plumbing facilities connected to the wastewater and potable water systems provided by North Sunter Utility Company, L.L.C., its successors and assigns ("NSU"). Upon acquiring any interest as an Owner of a Homesite in the Subdivision, each Owner hereby agrees to pay for water and sewer services provided by NSU. The charges for such services shall be billed and paid on a monthly basis. Private wells are prohibited.
- Section 2. Irrigation Water Utility Systems. The Villages Water Conservation Authority, L.L.C., its successors and assigns. ("VWCA"), is the provider of all irrigation water within the Subdivision. Upon acquiring any interest as an Owner of a Homesite in the Subdivision, each Owner hereby agrees to pay far irrigation water services provided by VWCA. The clarges for such services shall be billed and paid on a monthly basis. Owners are prohibited from utilizing or constructing private wells or other sources of irrigation water within the Subdivision. Possible water may not be used for irrigation, except that supplemental irrigation with potable water is limited to annuals and the isolated treatment of heat stressed areas. All supplemental trigation utilizing potable water must be done with a hose with an automatic almitoff nezels. Use of sprinklers on a hose connection is not permitted.
- (i) Irrigation Use Only. The irrigation water provided by VWCA is suitable for irrigation purposes only. The irrigation water can not be used for human or pet consumption, bathing, washing, car washing or any other use except for irrigation. Owners coverants to ensure that no one on the Homesile uses irrigation water for any non-irrigation purpose. The Owner agrees to indemnify and hold the Declarant, VWCA, and their officers, directors, and rulated entities harmless from any injury or damage resulting in whole or in part from the use of irrigation water or the irrigation system prohibited by Article VI.
- (ii) Operation of the Irrigation System. The irrigation water distribution system is not a water on demand system. Upon purchasing a Home from Declarant, Owner will receive a schedule of dates and times during which irrigation water service will be available for the Homesite ("Irrigation Water Service Schedule shall continue unaftered until such time as Owner is notified of changes to the Irrigation Water Service Schedule with Owner's monthly bill for irrigation water service or otherwise. The Irrigation Water Service Schedule shall be determined solely by VWCA, based upon many factors including environmental concerns and conditions, recent precipitation, and any water restrictions that may be instituted.

The Owner of the Homesite shall regulate the inrigation water service to the Homesite and will be responsible for complying with the Irrigation Water Service Schedule. If Owner repeatedly fails to comply with the Irrigation Water Service Schedule, VWCA may enter oute the Homesite, over and upon easements hereby reserved in favor of VWCA, and install a control valve to compel Owner's compliance with the Irrigation Water Service Schedule, with all costs related thereto being charged to Owner.

If now landscaping is installed on a Homesite, the Owner may allow additional irrigation water service at the Homesite to supplemental irrigation Water Service"), during the grow-in period, which is typically thirty (30) days. Supplemental irrigation Water Service at a Homesite may not exceed thirty (30) minutes of irrigation water service per day, during the grow-in period, in addition to the Irrigation Water Service Schedule. VWCA reserves the right to suspend Supplemental Irrigation Water Service at Homesites. Unless the Owner is notified of suspension or termination of the Supplemental Irrigation Water Service, Owner need not notify VWCA of their intention to utilize Supplemental Irrigation Water Service.

- (iii) Ownership and Maintenance. The Owner of a Honceite shall own and maintain the irrigation water distribution system downstream from the water meter measuring the amount of irrigation water supplied to the Honceite. VWCA shall own and resintain the irrigation water supply system upstream from, and including, the water meter measuring the amount of irrigation water supplied to the Honceite (the "VWCA Water Supply System"). Prior to commencing any underground activity which could damage the VWCA Water Supply System, the Owner shall contact VWCA to determine the location of the VWCA Water Supply System. Any damage to the VWCA Water Supply System shall be repaired by VWCA at the sole cost of the Owner.
- (iv) Identification of Irrigation System. The irrigation water distribution pipes are color-coded for identification with Pantone Purple 522C, which is invender in color, or a similar colorant. Owner hereby covenants and agrees not to paint any portion of the Owner's Irrigation System so as to obscure the colorcoding.

ARTICLE VIL. OWNER'S OBLIGATIONS OF MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR

Section 1. Maintenance Obligations.

- (a) Home, Homesite and adjoining areas. Subject to these restrictions, each Owner shall, at his solve cost and expense, repair his residence, other than as otherwise provided for herein, keeping the same in condition comparable to the condition of such residence at the time of its initial construction, excepting only normal wear and tran. Bach Homesite Owner shall be responsible for maintaining in a mowed, edged, neat and clean manner:
 - that portion of his Hamesite not subject to side yard or driveway casements,
 - (ii) his side yard easement area, driveway easement area and driveway, whether on his Homesito or on an adjacent Homesite, reserved area, or dedicated area, and
 - (iii) the uppayed area between an adjacent roadway or walkway located in the road right of way and the Owner's Homesite.
 - (iv) Owners of Homesites subject to a Special Basement for Landscaping, as shown on the Plat or described in Article IV above, shall perpetually maintain the vegetation located thereon, consistent with good harticultural practice. No owner of a Homesite which is subject to a Special Easement for Landscaping shall take any action to prevent the Landscaped Buffer from complying with those provisions of the Sander County Subdivision regulations requiring Landscaped Buffer areas.
- (b) Walls, Rences and Gates. Owners shall be responsible for all Wall and Fence maintenance not assumed by the District in ARTICLE II. Section 1. Subject to these restrictions each Owner shall peint and keep clean all fences and walls. The gate on the gate fence or wall shall be maintenance and repair of the structural integrity of all walls and fences serving the Owners shall be responsible for maintenance and repair of the structural integrity of all walls and fences serving the Owners shall be responsible for maintenance and repair of the structural integrity of all walls and fences serving the Owners Homesite or on an adjacent Homesite, reserved area, or dedicated area. Where a wall or fence serves more than one Homesite, the cost of maintaining and repairing the structural integrity of the wall or fence shall be shared among the respective Owners served by such wall. In addition, the Owners of Homesites 16, 22, 23, 34, 44, 54 and 61 that clean and paint the exterior portion of the wall or fence upon their Homesite facing the adjoining road right of way or patieng area. The Owners of Homesites 16, 17, 22, 45, 54 and 55 shall also clean and paint the interior portion of the security wall or fence upon and adjacent to the Homesite. Owners of Homesites on the perimeter of the Subdivision who must maintain the extentor of the fence on their Homesites are encouraged to do so in a cooperative and uniform manner with other as a whole.

All gates, walls and fraces must be of a uniform color and type of paint. Owners intending to paint must contact the Declarant or the District for paint specifications.

Section 2. If an Owner does not adhere to the above regulations, then the work may be performed on behalf of the Owner by the Declarant, but the Declarant shall not be obligated to perform such work, and the cost shall be charged to the Owner.

ARTICLE VIII. OWNER'S OBLIGATION TO REBUILD

If all or any portion of a residence is damaged or destroyed by fire or other casualty, it shall be the duty of the Owner thereof, with all due diligence, to rebuild repair, or reconstruct such residence and wells in a manner which will substantially restore it to its appearance and condition immediately prior to the casualty. Reconstruction shall be undertaken within two (2) months after the damage occurs, and shall be completed within six (6) months after the damage occurs, unless provented by governmental authority. Such reconstruction is subject to the provisions of these restrictions.

ARTICLE IX. PARKING RESTRICTIONS

No Owner of a Homesine shall park, store, or keep any vehicle except wholly within his driveway, gauge or other non-visitor parking spaces. No truck in excess of 3/4 ton, camper, boat, trailer, or sirreraft, or any vehicle other than a private non-commercial vehicle may be partied in a parking space except a boat may be kept in the garage with the garage door closed. No Owner of a Homesite shall repair or restore any motor vehicle, boat, trailer, sircraft, or other vehicle on any portion of any Homesite, or on dedicated or reserved areas, except for exergency repairs, and then only to the extent necessary to enable universent thereof to a proper repair facility.

ARTICLE X. ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL

- Section 1. Alterations, additions, and Improvements of Residences. No Owner, other than Declarant or its transferees, shall make any structural alteration, or shall undertake any extendor repainting or repair of, or addition to his residence, which would substantially after the extendor appearance thereof, without the prior written approval of the plans and specifications therefor by the Declarant or an architectural review committee exponented by the Declarant. The Declarant an architectural review committee designated by the Declarant shall grant its approval only in the event the proposed work (a) will benefit and enhance the entire Subdivision in a manner generally consistent with the plan of development thereof and (b) compiles with the construction plans for the surface water management system pursuant to Chaptez 40 D-4, F.A.C., approved and on file with the Southwest Florida Water Monagement District. All Fences and Walls must be of a uniform color and type of paint. Owners intending to paint their fence walls must contact the Declarant or the District for paint specifications.
- Section 2. Waiver and Release. When a building or other structure has been exceted or its construction substantially advanced and the building is located on any Homesite or building plot in a manner that constitutes a violation of these covenants and restrictions, the Declarant or an architectural review committee appointed by the Declarant may release the Homesite or building plot, or parts of it, from any part of the covenants and restrictions that are violated. The Declarant or the architectural review committee shall not give such a release except for a violation that it determines to be a minor or insubstantial violation in its sole judgment.

ARTICLE XL GENERAL PROVISIONS

- Section 1. Water Features. Owner recognizes that lakes, ponds, busins, retention and detention areas, marsh areas or other water related areas (hereafter, "Water Features") within or outside of the Subdivision are designed to detain, or retain atomical remotificant necessarily recharged by springs, creeks, rivers or other bodies of water. In many instances, the Water Features are designed to retain more water than may exist from ordinary rainstorms in order to accommodate major flood events. The level of water contained within such Water Features at any given time is also subject to naturally occurring swents such as drought, floods, or excessive rain. Owner acknowledges that from time to time there may be no water in a Water Feature and that no representation has been made that the water depth or height will be at any particular level.
- Section 2. Enforcement. All Owners shall have the right and duty to prosecute in proceedings at law or in equity against any person or persons violating or attempting to violate any covenants, conditions or restrictions, either to proved him or them from so doing, or to recover damages or any property charges for such violation. The cost of such proceedings, including a reasonable attorney's fire, shall be paid by the party losing said suit. In addition, the Declarant shall also have the right but not the duty to enforce any such covernals, conditions or restrictions as though Declarant were the Owner of the Homesite, including the right to recover reasonable attorney's fees and costs. Declarant may assign its right to enforce these covernants, conditions or reservations and to recover reasonable attorney's fees and costs to a person, committee, or governmental entity.
- Section 3. Severability. Invalidation of any one of these covenants or restrictions by judgment or court order shall in no way affect any other provisions, which shall remain in full force and effect.
- Section 4. Amendments. Coverants and restrictions of this Declaration may be amended by duly recording an instrument executed and acknowledged by the Declarant.
- Section 5. Subordination. No breach of any of the conditions herein contained or reentry by reason of such breach shall defeat or render invalid the lieu of any mortgage made in good faith and for value as to the Subdivision or any Homestin therein; provided, however, that such conditions shall be binding on any Owner whose title is acquired by foreclosure, trustee's sale, or otherwise.
- Section 6. Duration. The covenants and restrictions of this Declaration shall run with and bind the land, and shall have to the benefit of and be enforceable by the Declarant, or any Owner until the first day of Jamesry 2036 (except as elsowhere benefit expressly provided otherwise). After the first day of Jamesry 2036, said covenants, restrictions, reservations and servindes shall be automatically extended for successive periods of ten (10) years unless an instrument signed by the Declarant or his assignee shall be recorded, which instrument shall after, amend, calarge, extend or repeal, in whole or in part, said covenants, restrictions, reservations and servinde.
