As we wrap up a busy Summer of maintenance on the Executive Golf courses, we look forward to the Fall weather and bustling golf season ahead. All the hard work accomplished this Summer including aerifications, topdressing and cultural practices prepares the courses for the Winter play and increased traffic. Additionally, we are busy with full course renovations at Chula Vista, Amberwood, Pelican and Pimlico and more planned throughout the next year. The Executive Golf Maintenance department remains focused on raising standards and expectations for the Executive Golf courses. ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP

All District Executive Golf courses are part of the Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary Program and Certified Signature Sanctuary Program for golf courses. These programs focus on working with members on environmental areas such as water conservation and quality management, wildlife and habitat management, chemical reduction use and safety, environmental planning and outreach and education. The certification process is an ongoing endeavor which requires on-site visits by Audubon International for re-certification every three years.



Part of this environmental sustainability is planning and creating naturalized areas for wildlife habitat. As you play the Executive Golf courses, you will find some of these naturalized areas were incorporated with butterfly attracting plants and installation of bluebird boxes. Another area of focus is removing turf in non-playing areas that require mowing, fertilizing and watering – instead incorporating Florida friendly landscaping in naturalized beds. This practice aids in reducing inputs and focusing on the water conservation initiatives. Our department works closely with the golf course maintenance teams as they maintain the courses in order to adhere to the environmental standards in the Audubon programs.

Fall is around the corner!

As the summer comes to a close, the golf course maintenance teams are beginning to focus on post-cultural practices and dialing in for the fall season. With the aerifications all wrapped up, teams will spray pre-emergent herbicides wall to wall, going through landscape beds in preparation for pine straw applications, and concentrating on closing up any loose ends on the details of the golf courses. As we prepare for the season ahead, we also appeal to our residents and guests playing the courses to do their part. Avoiding heavy traffic areas with their carts, raking out footprints in the bunkers, filling divots with sand, and repairing ball marks on the greens are all ways to keep the courses going strong. TURF TIP

When playing the Executive Golf courses, you might come upon an area that was newly sodded, or wet areas that are staked off and roped for protection. These kinds of areas are free from play and we ask residents to avoid going in these areas. Other areas such as out of bounds or environmental areas are marked with stakes. A good way to tell Fall is approaching is by the blooming of the Muhly grasses throughout the golf courses and community. These grasses are mostly pink but also have a white variety and they start to bloom every fall which really makes the landscape beds pop. It's Florida's version of the leaves changing.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

The Executive Golf Courses are a living and breathing landscape, and evolving conditions regularly impact their anticipated life expectancies.

Variables such as weather and traffic may contribute to the need for enhanced revitalization needs. Golf course renovations and infrastructure improvements can and should be part of our regular planning, especially considering the constant increase in rounds played annually. Our focus remains not only on the design preservation and playability of the courses, but also the aesthetics. We currently have four full course renovations happening. Chula Vista, Amberwood, Pimlico and Pelican are all receiving new greens, tees, fairways and bunker sand. We are incorporating newer turf varieties TifGrand and TifEagle Bermuda grasses. Additionally, landscape enhancements, thorough tree maintenance and cart path repair round out these improvement projects.

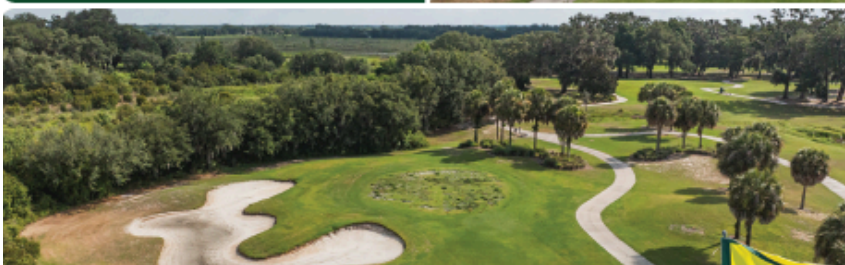

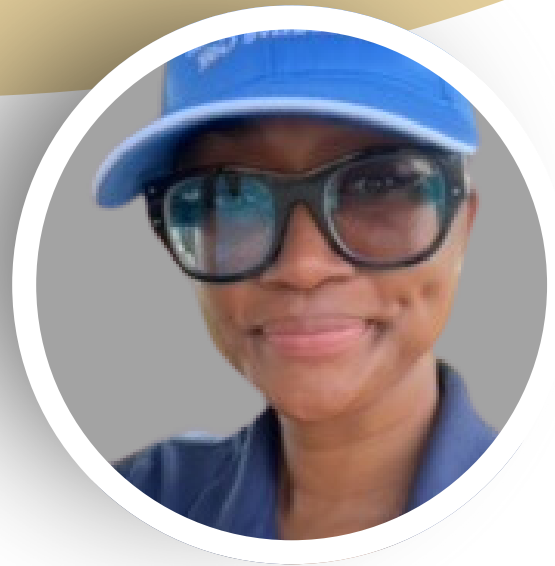
***It was January 2007
