
Year End

Here we are at the end of another Fiscal Year (Sept 30) and I wanted to reflect on all of the changes that we have experienced. Certainly, the Coronavirus is at the top of the list as impacting the way in which we have delivered our services. One thing was certain in that our District team never let us down in upholding our Core Values. At the end of a Fiscal Year, we complete all of our numbered and commercial District budgets, and again this is quite an accomplishment. We are no small operation with an "all-in" budget of \$400M and 14 residential or numbered Districts, three commercial Districts and two utility-dependent Districts. Yes, this Fiscal Year we added another residential District - District 14 - in Leesburg, Lake County and another utility Dependent District with the creation of the Wildwood Utility Dependent District for those potable and wastewater needs south of SR 44. Also, the recent census has shown that we are growing and that our average age is nearly 70 years of age. I have been working with my Department Directors and Administration Staff on several changes to reorganize our staff with the customer service delivery expectations we expect to experience and I have attached the organization chart below with a link to our website location if you would like to enlarge or reproduce it. Also, over the past year, we have all seen a number of new recreation facility staff members join our team to staff the Recreation Centers of Water Lily, Chitty Chatty, Bradford, Hawkins, Aviary, St. Catherine, and Citrus Grove. Cross-training has been evident between the front counter service areas of Recreation and Parks as well as Customer Service - this will surely enhance the customer experience! My hat off as we all congratulate our Community Watch Department as they celebrate their accreditation through the Florida Police Accreditation Coalition, Inc., and the fact that we are the first (non-PSAP) Public Safety Answering Point Agency is even better. Our very own (VPSD) Villages Public Safety Department has done an outstanding job educating The Villages on their very own Fire Department and the urbanized services that we offer our residents.

As we close out this Fiscal Year and begin a new one, stay tuned for future announcements.

Rare Sighting

A resident reported to Community Watch that while he was out for his morning walk at 5:50 AM on August 16, a flash of Florida Panther came running down the street and crossed St Charles place just a mere 4 feet in front of him. At the same time, Debbie Ogle, Patrol Driver was coming the other way and was able to position her vehicle between the panther and resident. Debbie then lit up the utility lights on her patrol vehicle. The panther stopped right where it was at on the golf course and stared back at the light source. The resident stated the speed at which the panther moves is just amazing and hard to believe. "At first I thought it was a Bobcat, until I got home and looked it up and this animal definitely was not, this was all Florida Panther! I want to thank Debbie for her quick thinking and for positioning her truck between me and the panther as fast as she did. When the panther ran in front of me like that, it really got the heart going. Debbie kept the truck positioned between me and the panther all the way down the street until we were out of range of the panther. I want to give a big thanks to Debbie and to Community Watch for all that they do. A call to the Florida Fish and Wildlife (FFW) confirmed that although very rare, Florida panthers will show up in this area from time to time. As scary as this encounter may have been, according to FFW a Florida panther attack on a human has never been documented." If you feel you have an encounter with a Florida Panther, first and foremost make sure you are safe. Call FFW as soon as possible and let them know so that they can track movements. Thank you Debbie for providing a safe community for residents by keeping a watchful eye around the clock. Residents thank you for your quick actions, and we at Community Watch thank you for doing a wonderful job.

National Preparedness Month is observed each September to raise awareness about the importance of preparing for disasters and emergencies that could happen at any time.

This year's theme: **Prepare to Protect**

Preparing for disasters is protecting everyone you love.

The peak hurricane season is from August 20th through early October with the pinnacle being September 10th. <u>Now is the time to prepare!</u> Hurricanes are not the only severe weather to expect during this time. While not a part of tornado alley, Florida sees more tornados than any other state when you consider its size.

Have a plan!

Talk to your friends and family about how you will communicate before, during, and after a disaster. Make sure to update your plan based on the Centers for Disease Control recommendations due to the coronavirus.

Build a Kit.

Gather supplies that will last for seven (7) days after a disaster for everyone living in your home. Don't forget to consider the unique needs each person or pet may have in case you have to evacuate quickly. Update your kits and supplies based on recommendations by the Centers for Disease Control in case of needing to go to a shelter.

Prepare for Disasters
