



Rísk Management



Each February, we celebrate American Heart Month by motivating Americans to adopt healthy lifestyles to prevent heart disease. Focusing on your heart health has never been more important. According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) heart disease is the leading cause of death for men, women, and people of most racial and ethnic groups in the United States. One person dies every 36 seconds in the United States from cardiovascular disease.

Research shows that we're more successful at meeting personal health goals when we join forces with others. When we take care of our hearts as part of our self-care, we set an example for those around us to do the same.

How to start:

Eat healthy foods: A healthy diet that is low in sodium and saturated fat is key to heart disease prevention.

- ⇒ Eating vegetables, fruits, and whole grains
- ⇒ Eating fish, poultry, beans, nuts, vegetable oils, and fat-free or low-fat dairy products
- ⇒ Limiting foods that are high in saturated fat and sodium
- ⇒ Limiting sugar and other sweeteners.





Move more: Get at least 2½ hours of physical activity each week - that's just 30 minutes a day, 5 days a week. In addition, do muscle strengthening exercises at least 2 days a week. Can't carve out a lot of time in your day? Try 5, 10, or 15 minutes a few times a day. Some physical activity is better than none.

Aim for a healthy weight: Being overweight is hard on your heart. It increases your risk of having heart disease, a stroke, high cholesterol, high blood pressure, and diabetes. Choosing heart-healthy foods and getting regular exercise will help you achieve and maintain a healthy weight.





Quit smoking: The chemicals in tobacco smoke harm your heart and blood vessels in many ways. Quitting is hard, but many people have succeeded, and you can too. Set a quit date and let those close to you know about it. Ask your family and friends for support in your effort. Tip: To keep your hands busy and be with others when you get urges, consider taking an online class for an activity like sewing, knitting, woodworking, art, or music.

Know your numbers: Meet your heart health goals by keeping track of how much you exercise, your blood pressure, your cholesterol numbers - all of which can impact your heart health - and tell your doctor how you're doing . Keeping a log of your blood pressure, weight goals, physical activity, and if you have diabetes, your blood sugars, will help you stay on a heart-healthy track. Visit your physician yearly, even when you are young and healthy.





Reduce stress and improve sleep: Stress can contribute to high blood pressure and other heart risks. Not getting enough sleep or regularly getting poor quality sleep increases the risk of having high blood pressure, heart disease, and other medical conditions. Aim for 7–8 hours of sleep a night. Practicing meditation, being more physically active, doing relaxation therapy, and talking with someone you trust can help you cope with stress and sleep better.

Our Hearts are healthier when we work together. There's a lot we can do to keep our hearts healthy. Even small changes can make a big difference. Best of all, connecting with others makes those efforts more successful. To help prevent heart disease, we need to: move more, follow a healthy eating plan, reduce stress, improve sleep, and quit smoking.

This February, and all of 2022, remember that taking care of your heart, is taking care of you.
