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### **Budget Preparation**





### Risk Management

### Heat Illness Prevention

It's May and that means Florida is heating up. May is National Heat Awareness month. Working outside in extreme heat or enjoying the weather on the weekends can cause heat related illness if not prevented. This May, practice safe measures and keep them in mind year round when out in the hot, humid, Florida weather. What are the different types of heat illness?

### **HEAT STROKE:**

- High body temperature (103°F or higher)
- Hot, red, dry, or damp skin
- Fast, strong pulse
- Headache, dizziness, or confusion
- Loss of consciousness (passing out)
- Nausea

### Know what to do:

- Heat Stroke is a medical emergency! Call 911 right away
- Move the person to a cooler place
- Help lower the person's temperature with cool cloths or a cool bath
- Do not give the person anything to drink

### **HEAT EXHAUSTION:**

- Heavy sweating
- Cold, pale, and clammy skin
- Fast, weak pulse
- Nausea or vomiting
- Muscle cramps
- Tiredness or weakness
- Dizziness or Headache
- Fainting

### Know what to do:

- Move to a cool place
- Put loose, cool, and wet cloths on your body or take a cool bath
- Sip water
- Get medical help right away if you are throwing up, symptoms get worse or last longer than 1 hour

#### **HEAT CRAMPS:**

- Heavy sweating during intense exercise
- Muscle pain or spasms

### *Know what to do:*

- Stop physical activity, cool down
- Drink water or a sports drink
- Wait for cramps to go away before additional physical activity
- Get medical help right away if you're on a low-sodium diet, have heart problems, or have cramps lasting longer than 1 hour



### Rísk Management

### SUNBURN:

- Painful, red, and warm skin
- Blisters on the skin

### What to do:

- <u>Prevention!</u> Always wear sunscreen. Apply it on your skin every day.
- Avoid sun in the middle of the day, from about 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. The ultraviolet rays, which cause sunburn, are strongest during this time.
- Wear protective clothing. Wear sunglasses that filter UV light.
- If you do get burned, stay out of the sun until your sunburn heals
- Put cool cloths or take a cool bath
- Use moisturizing lotion on sunburned areas
- Do not break blisters



### **HEAT RASH:**

• Red clusters of small blisters that look like pimples on the skin

### What to do:

- Stay in a cool, dry place
- Keep the rash dry
- Use powder (like baby powder) to soothe

### **DEHYDRATION:**

- Thirst
- Less-frequent urination
- Dry skin
- Fatigue
- Light-headedness
- Dizziness
- Confusion
- Dry mouth and mucous membranes
- Increased heart rate and breathing

### What to do:

- <u>Prevention!</u> Make sure you have plenty of water or fluids with electrolytes. Don't wait until you're thirsty; hydrate consistently while working by drinking approximately 1 cup every 15-20 minutes.
- Simple rehydration is recommended by drinking fluids. Many sports drinks on the market effectively restore body fluids, electrolytes, and salt balance. Cases of serious dehydration should be treated as a medical emergency, and hospitalization, along with intravenous fluids, is necessary. Immediate action should be taken.

Heat Illness is preventable. Follow heat safety prevention to keep you and your loved ones safe this summer.


