# UPDATES FROM YOUR DISTRICT GOVERNMENT

## POST-HURRICANE DEBRIS HAUL SCHEDULE

Following Hurricane Milton, the Village Community Development Districts engaged our debris hauling contractor, Ceres, to handle storm debris collection throughout The Villages. As local government entities, each District qualifies for Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) reimbursement for these cleanup efforts. Debris removal must be accurately coordinated, tracked, and separated (by District) for FEMA reimbursement purposes; so, this is a carefully planned, monitored, and executed operation.

Debris collection **began October 20, 2024**, and crews are working daily from sunrise until approximately sundown. Given our community's extensive size of over 90+ square miles, please be patient as the debris is collected. We will continue to provide updates as they are available on when you can anticipate collection to begin in your area.

#### Debris collection has been completed along the following roadways this week:

- Morse Boulevard District 1 and Lake Sumter Landing
- El Camino Real District 2
- Buena Vista Boulevard Districts 3 & 4
- Work is currently underway in the following areas:
- Districts 6 & 7 along Morse Boulevard
- District 5 along Buena Vista Boulevard

#### **Important Guidelines for Residents:**

- To ensure efficient collection and maintain community safety, please -
- Place all storm debris in the right of way of your residential property;
- Do not place debris in roadways, cul-de-sacs, or on driveways; and
- Keep debris clear of storm drain inlets and electrical boxes, and please do not use plastic bags for any storm debris.

We recognize that residents are eager to see debris removed from their neighborhoods. Currently, Ceres is managing limited resources due to multiple severe weather events affecting Florida and other states. District Management is actively working with Ceres to secure additional local resources to expedite the collection process.

As a reminder, storm debris eligible for special pickup includes items directly damaged or displaced by the hurricane, such as fallen tree branches, uprooted shrubs, broken fences, and roofing materials torn off by high winds. In contrast, regular yard maintenance waste, which is not eligible for this special collection, includes routine grass clippings, pruned branches from regular trimming, seasonal leaf fall, and hedge trimmings from normal landscaping activities.

#### **HOW TO PACKAGE AND TRANSPORT CHEMICALS**

- 1. Do NOT mix chemicals together.
- 2. Keep products in original labeled containers if possible.
- 3. Place containers into cardboard boxes to prevent breakage.
- 4. Place leaky container in clear plastic bag and transport in box with newspaper.
- 5. Put boxes in trunk or in back of vehicle away from passengers.

# **Household Hazardous Waste**

Do you have old paint sitting in the garage? An old empty propane tank? Leftover gasoline or used motor oil?

If so, these and other hazardous chemicals and items should not be placed in your regular household trash. The following locations will accept these items and more. Please contact the appropriate disposal site for full details.

#### **MARION COUNTY**

Marion County Marion County residents can dispose of the following items at any of the county's 18 recycling centers.

- Used motor oil & oil filters up to five gallons per day
- Fire extinguishers
- Latex paint up to five gallons per day
- Chemicals, gasoline, pesticides can be disposed of at the Baseline facility's Household Hazardous Waste area.
- Household electronics (accepted at Baseline, Dunnellon, Forest Corners, Fort McCoy, Martel, Newton, and Weirsdale (13535 SE 164th ST) recycling centers in the big green compactor boxes labeled "electronics recycling")

In addition, there are four special household electronics recycling events held at the McPherson Complex in Ocala throughout the year. The calendar of dates can be found at <u>Solid Waste | Marion County, FL (marionfl.org)</u>

#### **LAKE COUNTY**

Lake County Lake County residents can dispose of hazardous waste at the Household Hazardous Waste Center located at 13130 County Landfill Road, County Road 561, Tavares with proof of residency. There are also Mobile Unit Events held throughout the year in various Lake County locations.

- Automotive fluids (Antifreeze, Gasoline, Motor Oil, etc.)
- Paint Products
- Lawn/Garden (Fertilizers, Insecticides, Pesticides, etc.)
- Propane cylinders


