DECLARATION OF COVENANTS, CONDITIONS
AND RESTRICTIONS

FOR THE VILLAGES OF MARION

WAVERLY VILLAS

Unit 217

For the purpose of enhancing and protecting the value, attractiveness and destrability of the loss or tracts contributing such Subdivision, Declarant hereby declares that all of the Homesites (as hereinafter defined), and each part thereof shall be held, sold, and conveyed only subject to the following externents, coverants, conditions, and restrictions, which shall constitute covenants running with the land and shall be binding on all parties having any right, title, or interest in the above described property or any part thereof, their heirs, successors, and assigns, and shall inure to the benefit of each owner thereof.

ARTICLE L DEFINITIONS

- Section 1. "Common Area" shall mean all real property shown on the plat referenced above conveyed to the District and dedicated for the common use and enjoyment of the uwners or residents of the District or the public, together with additions in accordance herewith. Title to the Common Area shall be conveyed to the District and dedicated for common use free and clear of any liens or encumbrances.
- Section 2. "Declarant" thail mean THE VILLAGES OF LAKE-SUMTER, INC. and its successors and assigns.
- Section 3. "District" shall mean the Village Community Development District No. 4, a community development district created purposes to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes.
- Section 4. "Florresite" shall mean any unit of land designated as a lot on the recorded subdivision plat referred to abuve.
- Section 5. "Maintenance" shall mean the exercise of reasonable cure and repair to keep buildings, roads, landscaping, lighting, lawns, water and sewer distribution agricum, storm water two off collection systems, and other related improvements and flatures to good repair and condition. Maintenance of landscaping shall further mean the exercise of generally accepted garden-management practices necessary to promote a healthy, weed-free environment for optimum plant growth.
 - Section 6. "Mongage" shall mean a conventional montgage.
- Section 7. "Institutional First Mongage" shall mean a first lies mortgage granted by an Owner to a bank, savings and loan association, pension fund trant, real estate investment trust, or insurance company.

Section 8. "Owner" shall mean the record owner, whether one or more persons or entities, of a fee simple title to any Homesite which is a part of the Subdivision, and shall include contract sollers, but shall not include those holding title merely as security for performance of an obligation.

Section 9. "Subdivision" shall mean the subdivided real property bereinbefore described and such additions thereto as may be brought within the jurisdiction of these restrictions as bereinafter provided.

ARTICLE IL THE DISTRICT

- Section 1. Services Provided by the District. The District shall have such authority and perform those services consisted with Chapter 190 of the Florida Statutes. Services shall include, but not limited to the following:
- (a) Maintenance and repair of the Common Area held by the District or dedicated to the use and enjoyment of the residents of the District, the Subdivision, or the public;
- (b) Water, sewer, garbage, electrical, lighting, telephone, gas and other necessary utility service for the Common Area;
 - (c) Maintenance and repair to roads within the Subdivision:
- (d) Maintenance and repair of the storm water runoff drainings system including drainings easements and drain pipes.
- Section 2. District Assessments. The District shall have the authority to impose assessments persuant to the authority granted under Chapter 190 of the Florida Statutes.
- Section 3. No Mulntenance by Marion County. No maintenance services on the roadways, drainage easements, drain pipes, or any other maintenance services within the Subdivision will be performed by county sovernment of Marion County, Figurds.

ARTICLE IIL THE VILLAGES AMENITIES FEE

Each Owner hereby agrees to pay a monthly fee, or charge (the "Amenities Fee") against each Homesite for the benefit and use of the recreational and other amenities of The Villages of Lake. The Villages of Sumfer and The Villages of Marion in the amount per month set forth in such Owner's Deed. The Amenities Fee set forth is limited to the Owner named therein. In the event the Owner(s) transfers, assigns or in any way conveys their interest in and to the Homesite, the new Owner(s) shall be obligated to pay the prevalent Amenities Fee sum that is then in force and effect for new Owner(s) of Homesites in the most recent addition or unit of The Villages of Lake. The Villages of Sumfer of The Villages of Marion. The monthly Amenitles Fee as set forth in this section is based on the cost of living for the month of sale as reflected in the Consumer Price Index. ARTICLE IV. PROPERTY RIGHTS

Socion 1. Reciprocal Econometa. There shall can a reciprocal appartenant extensions between adjacent Humanites and between Hemetites and adjacent Common Area or reserved area. Each Hometite may be both benefitted and burdened by side yard extensions, extensions for fogunatiand egress, and extensions for maintainance. Such title varif extensions shall be as described below:

(a) Side Yard Expensents.

(1) Scope and Dutesion. There shall exist for the benefit and use of the dominant tenement side yard assuments over and upon the services tenement. The example of shall be perpetual and the holder of the dominant enterment that! have exclusive use of that sortion of the services tenement burdence by the side yard example, accept that the services tenement shall recent the following rights:

- (i) The Owner of the servient renement shall have the right at all reasonable times to calcrupon the externent area, including the right to cross over the dominant tenement for such entry, in order to perform work related to the use and maintenance of the servicul tenement. In exercising the right of entry upon the casement area as provided for above, the Owner of the servicus tenement agrees to unifize reasonable cure not to damage any landscoping or other items existing in the executent area.
- (ii) The servicus tenement shall have the right of drainage over, across and upon the easement area for water draining from the roof of any dwelling or structure upon the servicus tenement, the right to maintain caves and appointmances thereto and the portions of any dwelling structure upon the servicus tenement as originally constructed at an encountracted pursuant bears.
- (iii) The Owner of the dominum renement shall not attach any object to a wall or the client belonging to the services tenement or disturb the grading of the easement area or offserwise act with respect to the easement area in any manner which would damage the services becoment.
- Description of the Side Yard Essement. The dominant tenement shall be the property benefited by the use of the side yard essement, and the servical tenement shall be the property burdened by the side yard essement. The side yard essement shall extend over that portion of the servical tenement, lying between the exterior of the side dwelling wall of the servical tenement (on the garage side) and adjoining side Homerite lot like of the adjoining dominant tenement; and also extending from the exterior of the said side dwelling wall of the servical tenement in a straight line with the exterior side wall to the rear Homerite lot line of servical tenement; and also that portion of the servical tenement lying between the driveway of the servical tenement as originally constructed by the developer, and the adjoining side Homesite lot line of the dominant tenement. The dominant tenement shall be responsible for maintenance of the side yard essential.
- (3) Lots Affected by the Side Yard Entertaint. The side yard enterted shall benefit and burden the following Homesites:
 - (i) Homesites both burdened and benefitted by side yard extensions shall be Homesites 3 through 6, 9 through 27, 31 through 34, 39 through 51, 54 through 67, and 72 through 86.
 - Homesites burdened but not benefitted by aide yard casements shall be Homesites 7, 8, 30, 52, 53, and 87.

- (iii) Homesites benefited but not bordered by side yard essences shall be Homesites 2, 28, 35, 38, 68, and 71.
- Section 2. Owner's Execuents of Enjoyment in Common Areas. Every Owner of a Homesic shall have a right and executed of ingress and egress and enjoyment in and to the Common Area.
- Section 3. Exerments of Eneroschustent. There shall exist reciprocal appartenant extenents as between adjacent thomesties and between each Housesite and any portion or portions of the Common Area, reserved and dedicated areas adjacent thereto for any exercaschment due to the normalifel placement, sending, or shifting of the improvements constructed, reconstructed, or altered thereon, provided such construction, reconstruction, or altersion is it accommon to the common boundary between adjacent Homestice, and between each Homestic send as measured from any point on the common boundary between adjacent Homestice, and between each Homestic send any adjacent portion of the Common Area. Within these excessed, no structure, pleating, or other material shall be placed or permitted to contain which may damage or talerface with the installation and maintenance of milities, or which may damage, interfere with, or change the direction of flow of drainings facilities in the externed. The externed area of each Homeaite and all improvements therein shall be continuously maintained by the Owner of such Homeaite, except for improvements for maintenance of which a public suddority or utility company is responsible. Declarate contemplates constructing pation and similar improvements. Utility providers militaing such casement area coverient, as a condition of the right to use such externed, not to interfere or distants such equipment in talling the right to such externed, utility providers are coveraged to install utilities pursuant to a folial Trench Agreement. All utility providers are responsible for repairing the grading and landscape being datastated pursuant to any unification of such extensests.
- (b) No discillage text of each relative of any kind icchiding (cocing shall be built, exected, or maintained on any such exertical citizer created in this Reclaration or as shown on the plat, or by reservation or zight or way, except that pation and walks may be constructed by the dominant renement over the exarment reserved over the strip of trust running along the ride Homeute for this of each Homeute, and also except for the white picket fence as originally constructed by the Declarant. Such extension, neverations, and rights of way shall at all times be open and accessible to public und quant-public utility comportation, their employees and contactors, and shall also be open and accessible to Declarant, its successors and assigns, all of whom shall have the right and privilege of doing whatever may be recessary in, on, under, and above such locations to carry out any of the purposes for which such extension, referentions, and rights of way are reserved.

Section 5. No Partition. There shall be no judicial partition of the Common Area, nor shall Declarant, or any Owner or any other person acquiring any interest in the Subdivision or any part thereof, seek judicial partition thereof. However nothing contained herein shall be construed to prevent judicial partition of any Homesice owned in co-tenancy.

ARTICLE V. USE RESTRICTIONS

The Subdivision shall be occupied and used only as follows:

Section 1. The Subdivition is an adult community designed to provide housing for persons 55 years or age or older. All homes that are occupied must be occupied by at least one person who is at least lifty-five (55) years of age. No person under nineteen (19) years of age may be a permanent resident of a home, except that persons below the age of ninetean (19) years may be permitted to visit and temporarily reside for periods not exceeding thirty (30) days in total in any calendar year period. The Declarant or its designed in its sole discretion shall have the right to establish hardship exceptions to permit individuals between the ages of nineteen (19) and fifty-five (55) to permanently reside in a home even though there is not a permanent resident in the home who is fifty-five (55) years of age or over, providing that said exceptions shall not be permitted in situations where the granting of a hardship exception would result in less than 80% of the Homestica in the Subdivision having less than one resident fifty-five (SS) years of age or older, it being the latent that at least 80% of the units shall at all times have at least one resident fifty-five (55) years of age or older. The Declarant shall establish rules, regulations policies and procedures for the purpose of assuring that the foregoing required percentages of adult occupancy are maintained at all times. The Dectarant or its designes shall have the sole and abrolute authority to deny occupancy of a home by any person(s) who would thereby create a violation of the aforesaid percentages of adult occupancy. Permanent occupancy or residency may be further defined in the Rules and Regulations of the Subdivision as may be promulgated by the Declarant or its designee from time to time. All retidents shall certify from time to time as requested by the Declarant, the names and dates of birth of all occupants of a home.

- Section 2. No business of any kind shall be conducted on any residence with the exception of the business of Declarant and the transferres of Declarant in developing and selling all of the Horpestics as provided herein.
- Section 3. No notious or offensive activity shall be carried on in or on any Homesite with the exception of the business of Declarant and the transferoes of Declarant in developing all of the Homesites as provided herein.
- Section 4. Nu sign of any kind shall be displayed to public view on a Homesite or the Common Area without the prior written consent of the Declarant, except customery name and address signs. Professional signs advertising a property for sale or rent shall be permitted. Lawn ornaments are prohibited, except for seasons durplays not exceeding a thirty (30) day duration.

Section 5. Nothing shall be done or kept on a Homesite or on the Common Area which would increase the rate of insurance relating thereto without the prior written content of the Declarant, and no Owner shall permit anything to be done or kept on his Homesite or the Common Area which would result in the cancellation of insurance on any retidence or on any part of the Common Area, or which would be in violation of any law.

Section 6. Birds, fish, dogs and cots shall be permitted, with a maximum of two (2) pets per Homesite. Each Owner shall be personally responsible for any damage caused the Consmon Area by any such pet and shall be responsible to immediately remove and dispose of any exercented of such pet and shall be responsible to keep such pet on a leash. No other animals, furestock, or poultry of any kind shall be raised, bred, or kept on any Homesite or on the Common Area.

Section 7. No rubbish, trush, garbage, or other waste material shall be kept or permitted on any Homesite or on the Common Area except in stantary containers located in appropriate treas concealed from public view.

Section 8. No fence, hedge, wall, or other dividing instrumentality shall be constructed or maintained on any Homesite, except for any fencing originally constructed by the Declarant. In order to maintain a visible readway, no bush, shrub, tree, or other similar plant may be placed within the read eight-of-way. Concrete and driveway coatings are permitted providing that the design is harmonious with the Subdivision and that such coating is the same color as the home. No logarest or egress to or from any Homesite is permitted except pursuant to such driveways and sidewalks as originally constructed by Declarans.

Section 9. No outbuilding, tent, shack, garage, traller, shed, utility building or temporary building of any kind shall be exected, except temporarily only for construction purposes. No arbor, trallis, gazebo, pergota (or similar item), awning, fence, burner, wall or structure of any kind or nature shall be placed on the property without prior written appropriat of the Declarati.

Section 10. Nothing shall be aftered in, constructed on, or removed from the Common Area except on the written consent of the Declarant, after the original development thereof by the Declarant.

Section 11. The hanging of clothes or clothesitines or piscing of clothes poles is prohibited to the extent allowed by law. No certain assettlite reception dishes, or antennas of any kind nor window six-conditioners or impation wells are permitted within the Subdivision, except as specifically allowed by law. The incation of any improved device will be as previously approved by the Declaratt in writing.

Section 12. All garbage will be contained in plantic bags prescribed by Declarant and placed curbside no earlier than the day before scheduled pick-up. In the alternative, the Declarant shall have the right to require that garbage be placed in a dumpster and not placed curbside. In either event, all garbage must be contained in fully closed and sealed plantic bags prescribed by the Declarant. Garbage and trash service shall be provided by a carrier selected by the Declarant, and charges pard separately by each Owner. Owner agrees that garbage and trash service shall commence on the closing date the Owner purchases Owner's Homestre and home. Owner acknowledges that garbage and trash services it provided, and the fee for such service is payable, on a year-round basis regardless of use or occupancy. Declarant reserves the right to require all Owner's to participate in a curbside recycling program if and when one is fastituted.

Section 13. Owner(s) shall use his property to such a manner as to allow his neighbors to enjoy the use of their property. Radios, record players, television, voices and other sounds are to be kept on a moderate level from 10:00 p.m. to one (1) hour before daylight. These certricities shall not apply to construction noises being made by the Declarant.

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Section 14. The Declarant reserves the right to prohibit or control all peddling, soliciting, selling, delivery and vehicular utility within the Subdivision.

Section 15. The Declarant reserves the right to establish such other reasonable rules and regulations covering the utilization of the Homesites by the Owner(s) in order to maintain the acuthetic qualities of this Subdivision, all of which apply equally to all of the parties in the Subdivision and the rules and regulations shall take affect within five (5) days from the sending of a notice to an Owner(s).

Section 16. Individual maliboxes may not be located upon a Homesite. Maliboxes are provided by the U.S. Postal Service at no cost to Owner, however, those boxes shall be housed by Declarant at a one time lifetime charge to Owner of \$100,00 per box. If title to a Homesite is transferred, a new charge shall be made to the new Owner. Payment of this (ce shall be a condition collectible in the same manner as the maintenance fee and shall constitute a tien against the Homesite until it is paid. The malibox fee may be increased in the same percentages and manner as increases in The Villages Amenities Fee.

Section 17. Declarant or the trunsferess of Declarant shall undertake the work of developing all Homerikes included within the Subdivision. The completion of that work, and the sale, rental, or other disposition of residential units is essential to the establishment and welfare of the Subdivision as an ongoing residential community. In order that such work may be completed and the Subdivision be establishes as a fully occupied residential community as soon as possible, nothing in this Declaration shall be understood or construed to:

- (a) Prevent Declarant, Declarantk transferees, or the employees, contractors, or subcontractors of Declarant or Declarantk transferees from doing on any part or parts of the Subdivision owned or controlled by Declarant transferees or their representatives, whatever they determine may be reasonably necessary or advisable in connection with the completion of such work;
- (b) Prevent Declarant, Declarant's transferrer, or the engloyees, contractors, or subcontractors of Declarant's transferrer itemeonstructing and maintaining on any part of parts of the Subdivision property owned or controlled by Declarant, Declarant's transferrer, or their representatives such structures as may be reasonably necessary for the completion of such work, the establishment of the Subdivision as a residential community, and the disposition of Biomestics by sale, lease, or otherwise;
- (e) Prevent Declarant, Declarant's transferrest, or the employees, contractors, or subcontractors of Declarant's transferrest from conducting on any part or parts of the Subdivision property owned or controlled by Declarant's transferrest or their representatives, the business of completing such work, of establishing the Subdivision as a residential community, and of disposing of Homesties by sale, lease, or otherwise; or
- (d) Prevent Declarant's transferres, or the employees, contractors, or subcontractors of Declarant or Declarant's transferres from maintaining such sign or signs on any of the Homesites owned or controlled by any of them as may be necessary in connection with the sale, leave or other disposition of Subdivision Homesites.

As used in this section, the words "its transferees" specifically exclude purchasers of Homerites improved with completed residences. Section 18. Notes such circle person may enter onto any wildful opresence set forth within the areas designated as such in the Development Order entered in connection with The Villages of Marion, a Florida Quality Development, or as it may be amended from time to time.

Section 19. It shall be the responsibility of each property Owner within the Subdivision at the time of construction of a building, residence, or structure, to comply with the construction plans for the surface water management system pursuant to Chapter 40C-4, F.A.C., approved and on file with the St. Johns River Water Management District (SJRWhID). No Owner of property within the Subdivision may construct or maintain any building, residence, or structure, or undertake or perform any activity in the wallands, militation areas, buffer areas, and upland conservation areas described in the approved permit and recorded plat of the Subdivision unless prior written approval is received from the SJRWMD purmant to Chapter 40C-4.

ARTICLE VI. OWNER'S OBLIGATIONS OF MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR

Section 6. Subject to the requirements set (orth berein, each Owner shall, at his sole cost and expense, repair this residence, other than as otherwise provided for herein, keeping the same to condition comparable to the condition of such residence at the time of its initial construction, excepting only normal wear and tear. Each Homesite Owner shall be responsible for maintaining his driveway. Owners of Homesites subject to a Special Exament for Landscaping, as shown on the Plat or described in Article IV above, shall perpensally maintain the vegetation located thereon, consistent with good horticultural practice. No owner of a Homesite which is subject to a Special Exament for Landscaping shall take any action to prevent the Landscaped Buffer from complying with those provisions of the Marion County Subdivision regulations requiring Landscaped Buffer areas.

- Section 2. The party responsible for maintenance must contact the Declarant or the Architectural Control Committee for paint specifications.
- Section 3. Each Owner shall keep his Homesite near and clean and the gross cut and edged at all times and abail also maintain the unpaved area between an adjacent madway and the Owner's front and side Homesite for lines.
- Section 4. If an Owner does not adhere to the above regulation, then the work may be performed on behalf of the Owner by the Daciarant, or its designee and the cost shall be charged to the Owner.

ARTICLE YIL OWNER'S OBLIGATION TO REBUILD

If all or any portion of a residence is damaged or destroyed by fire or other casualty, it shall be the duty of the Owner thereof, with all due diligence, to rebuild, repair, or reconstruct such residence in a manner which will substantially restore it to its appearance and condition immediately prior to the casualty. Reconstruction shall be undertaken within two (2) months after the damage occurs, and shall be completed within six (6) months after the damage occurs, unless prevented by governmental authority. Such reconstruction its subject to the provisions of these Restrictions.

ARTICLE VIII. PARKING RESTRICTIONS

No Owner of a Horcesite shall park, store, or keep any vehicle except wholly within his driveway or garage.

No track in excess of 3/4 ton, examper, book trailer, or aircraft, or any vehicle other than a private non-commercial vehicle

may be parked in a parking space except a boat may be kept in the garage with the garage door closed. No Owner of a Homestic phall repair or restore any motor vehicle, boat, trailer, aircraft, or other vehicle on any portion of any Homestic, or othe Common Area, except for emergency repairs, and then only to the extent necessary to enable movement thereat to a proper repair facility.

ARTICLE IX. ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL

Section 1. Alternations, additions, and improvements of Residences. No Owner, other than Declarant or its transferces, shall make any suncreast alteration, or shall undertake any exterior repainting or repair of, or addition to his residence, which would substantially alter the exterior appearance thereof, without the prior written approval of the plans and specifications therefor by the architectural committee appointed by the Declarant. The Declarant or an architectural controlled designased by the Declarant thati grant its approval only in the event the proposed work will be define and enhance the entire Subdivision in a manner generally consistent with the plan of development thereof.

Section 2. Walver and Release. When a building or other structure has been erected or its constitution substantially advanced and the building is located on any Homesite or building plot in a manner that constitutes a violation of these covenants and restrictions, the Declarant may release the Homesite or building plot, or parts of it, from any part of the covenants and restrictions that are violated. The architectural committee shall not give such a release except for a violation that it determines to be a prince or insubstantial violation in its sole judgment.

ARTICLE X. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 1. Enforcement. Declarant, or any Owner shall have the right to enforce, by and proceeding at Law or in equity, all restrictions, conditions, covenants, essentials, reservations, liens, and charges now or increafter imposed by the provisions of this Declaration. Cost of such proceedings, including attorney's fee, shall be paid by the party tosing said suit. Fallure by Declarant, or by any Owner to enforce any coverage or estaticition herein contained shall inno event he deemed a walver of the right to do so thereafter.

Section 2. Severability. Invalidation of any one of these covenants or restrictions by judgment or court order chall in no way affect any other provisions, which shall remain in foll focco and effect.

Section 3. Amendmental Covenance and restrictions of this Declaration may be amended by duly recording an instrument executed and acknowledged by the Declarant.

Section 4. Subordination. No breach of any of the conditions herein contained or reentry by reason of such breach shall defeat or render invalid like iten of any mortgage made in good faith and for value as to the Subdivision or any Homesite therein; provided, however, that such conditions shall be binding on any Owner whose title is sequired by foreclosure, stustee's sale, or otherwise.

Section 5. Duration. The covenants and restrictions of this Declaration shall run with and bind the land, and shall intre to the benefit of and be enforceable by the Declarate, or any Owner for a period or ninety-nine (99) years from the data hereof. Thereafter, they shall be automatically extended for additional periods of ten (10) years unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the then Owners of at least three-quarters (3/4) of the Subdivision Homesites.
