COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT UPDATE

The Villages Community Development Districts own an extensive stormwater system that spans over 200 miles, featuring pipes ranging from 4 inches to 72 inches in diameter. These pipes are constructed from various materials, including reinforced concrete, spiral rib aluminized steel, and high-density polyethylene, each with its own specific maintenance requirements. Given the scale and complexity of this infrastructure, a comprehensive routine inspection program is essential to ensure its effective operation.

In May 2022, District Property Management (DPM) made a significant investment by acquiring a Deep Trekker Crawler System, a state-of-the-art remotely operated vehicle designed for video inspections of stormwater pipes. This innovative technology enables DPM to quickly identify issues within the stormwater system without the delays associated with scheduling contractors for inspections.

In cases where a pipe is suspected of having a problem or requires urgent inspection, the Deep Trekker allows DPM to carry out assessments efficiently and effectively. Remarkably, within less than a year of its acquisition, the cost savings generated from emergency inspections conducted by DPM staff surpassed the initial investment in the Deep Trekker Crawler System.

This advanced tool not only streamlines our inspection process but also plays a crucial role in optimizing resources and ensuring responsible stewardship of our stormwater infrastructure. By leveraging such technology, we can maintain the integrity of our stormwater system, ultimately benefiting the entire community.

Household Hazardous Waste

Do you have old paint sitting in the garage? An old empty propane tank? Leftover gasoline or used motor oil?

If so, these and other hazardous chemicals and items should not be placed in your regular household trash. The following locations will accept these items and more. Please contact the appropriate disposal site for full details.

MARION COUNTY

Marion County Marion County residents can dispose of the following items at any of the county's 18 recycling centers.

Used motor oil & oil filters up to five gallons per day

Fire extinguishers

Latex paint up to five gallons per day

Chemicals, gasoline, pesticides can be disposed of at the Baseline facility's Household Hazardous Waste area.

Household electronics (accepted at Baseline, Dunnellon, Forest Corners, Fort McCoy, Martel, Newton, and Weirsdale (13535 SE 164th ST) recycling centers in the big green compactor boxes labeled "electronics recycling")

HOW TO PACKAGE AND TRANSPORT CHEMICALS

- 1. Do NOT mix chemicals together.
- 2. Keep products in original labeled containers if possible.
- 3. Place containers into cardboard boxes to prevent breakage.
- 4. Place leaky containers in clear plastic bags and transport in box with newspaper.
- 5. Put boxes in trunk or in back of vehicle away from passengers.

Protect our sanitation workers

All resident and business trash is picked up by hand. When trash isn't disposed of properly, it puts our sanitation workers at risk of injury and other hazards.



Keep our workers safe by properly bagging your trash in a tightly sealed tall kitchen bag and placing it at the end of your driveway. Additional reminders for safe disposal are below.



SHARP OBJECTS

Glass and sharp objects should be wrapped in newspaper and placed in your trash bag.

Loose glass can rip trash bags and cause cuts and scrapes on the body of you or our workers.



YARD WASTE

Tree limbs and brush – like sylvester palms – should be bundled and placed at the end of the driveway. The limbs may not exceed 4" in diameter and the palm fronds should face the same direction. Lawn clippings and similar yard waste must be placed in bags.

If not disposed of properly, these items pose challenges with safe handling and loading as well as equipment damage.



MATERIALS NOT ACCEPTED

Needles, hospital medical waste, paint, oil, lawn or pool chemicals, motor oil or tires are not accepted.

These items can cause fires, damage garbage trucks, are harmful to the environment, and may expose workers to needle stick injuries and potential infection.
