

Golf Etiquette

- Keep golf cars on designated paths to help preserve the course and its beauty.
- Use a ball mark repair tool to gently fix any ball marks, smoothing them over with your putter or foot, ensuring the greens remain in excellent condition.
- After leaving a bunker, take a moment to smooth over any holes or footprints with the provided rake, leaving the sand pristine for the next player.
- Be proactive in maintaining the course by filling divots and repairing ball marks, contributing to a better experience for all golfers.
- Be mindful of your surroundings by staying quiet and out of view when golfers are preparing to hit. Keep your phone off and remain aware of others' swings.

- Help maintain a smooth pace of play so everyone can enjoy their round without delays.
- Respect your fellow golfers by standing in a place where you won't distract them, and always remain still while they hit.
- If you hit a ball in the direction of another player, always shout "FORE!" to alert others and keep the game safe.
- Once everyone has finished putting, make your way to the next tee promptly, keeping the game flowing smoothly.
- Sand your divots to help the turf recover and keep the course in top shape for future rounds.
- Always park golf cars with all four wheels on the cart path near tee boxes and greens to protect the turf, and use the path when moving between shots to avoid damaging the fairway.
