### **LIGHTNING SAFETY WEEK - June 22-28, 2025**

The last week in June is <u>National Lightning Safety Awareness Week.</u> This informative National Week is an effort by the National Weather Service to help increase lightning safety. It may be shocking to learn that lightning is one of the deadliest weather systems. Records kept by the <u>National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration</u> (NOAA) show lightning harms more people in the U.S. than any other weather factor.

Lightning Safety Awareness Week reminds people there is no safe place outdoors when a thunderstorm is in the area. Lightning can strike from over 15 miles away. The chances are if you can hear thunder, you are already in immediate danger. A lot of lightning injuries and fatalities happen because people were too slow to react to an approaching storm or too quick to get back outdoors before the storm was a safe distance away.

### **Lightning Facts:**

- 1. The most dangerous times tend to be immediately before a storm hits and right as it moves away.
- 2. About 25 million cloud-to-ground lightning strikes occur in the U.S. each year.
- 3. The U.S. has averaged 51 lightning fatalities per year over the last 30 years.
- 4. Since the first Lightning Safety Awareness Week, the number of annual lightning deaths has dropped to almost half.
- 5. Wait 30 minutes after the last lightning or thunder before going back outside.

### **Lightning Victims**

If someone is struck by lightning, they may need immediate medical attention.

Lightning victims do not carry an electrical charge and are safe to touch. Call 911 and monitor the victim. Start CPR or use an Automated External Defibrillator, if needed.


### National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES)

With the Villages growing each year, it is important for all of us to be aware of the environmental impacts daily actions can have on the areas around us. It is important that we are aware that our daily actions do not negatively affect the environment. The Villages community participates in the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit program or NPDES. This program is administered by the State of Florida through the Department of Environmental Protection and is required by the Federal Clean Water Act.

The District has a program and policy that prohibits illicit discharges of pollutants into our storm drain system and drainage basins. Some examples of these pollutants include oil, automotive fluids, paints, stains, pesticides, discarded or abandoned objects, and other liquid and solid wastes.

It is important for our residents to become aware and educated so that they can help decrease or eliminate stormwater runoff pollution through preventative measures. There are many best practices that can be followed to help mitigate runoff pollution. Some examples are, but not limited to, recycle automotive fluids, minimize chemical applications near water bodies, compost yard waste, collect and properly dispose of pet waste, to name a few.

With everyone working together as a caring community, we can have a quality program to eliminate pollutants into the storm drainage system. With pollutant free ponds, lakes and wetlands, the wildlife and environment in which we co-inhabit can continue to be enjoyed for many years to come.

Bond Cut-Off Date: July 18, 2025

If you are interested in paying off your Bond in full, our next Bond Cut-Off date is Friday, July 18, 2025. If the Bond is paid off in full by 5:00pm on July  $18^{th}$ , the bond assessment will no longer appear on your annual County Property Tax bill. This option allows you to avoid future interest payments on your Bond.

Please call the Bond Team at 352-751-3900 for the payoff amount and instructions on how to submit your check. Payments can be placed in the District Drop Boxes located at each Postal Station up until July 15th. If you are paying after July 15th, please call our office to schedule an appointment to come in and pay. If mailing your payment, allow enough time for it to reach us by the 18<sup>th</sup>.

Please remember that even when the Bond is paid in full, there will continue to be an annual Maintenance assessment on your County property tax bill which pays for ongoing costs to maintain the infrastructure of your District.

You are not required to pay off your Bond in advance. You can continue to pay the Bond through the annual assessment on your County Property Tax bill.

# HOLIDAY SANITATION SCHEDULE Independence Day



### **Village Community Development Districts 1-11**

If you live in Village Community Development Districts 1-11 in the Sumter County, Marion County or Fruitland Park portions of The Villages, there will be no changes to the sanitation collection schedule on Friday, July 4, 2025.

### **Village Community Development Districts 12-15**

If you live in Village Community Development District 12-15 of the Villages, there will be no changes to the sanitation collection schedule on Friday, July 4, 2025.

If you live in the **Lake County portion of the Villages** (not including VCDD No. 11 or 14), Friday collection will occur on Saturday.

If you live in the **Town of Lady Lake portion** of The Villages, Friday services will be performed on Tuesday, July 8, 2025.

If you live in the **Middleton Community Development District**, there will be no changes to the sanitation collection schedule.





## SANITATION

- All household solid waste and yard waste are picked up twice a week - between 6 am -5 pm.
- All household waste should be placed in sealed tall kitchen trash bags, or 20-30 gallon trash bags.
   Any color is acceptable with the exception of red, which is used for medical waste.
- All materials can be placed in the same bag, no need to sort.



- The trash bags should be left at the end of your driveway. NO garbage cans are allowed, or they will be disposed of along with the household waste.
- · Each bag should weigh no more than 40 pounds.
- Bags must be placed for collection before 6 AM on collection day, or the night before, no earlier than 5 PM.
- Wrap broken glass or sharp objects in newspaper and place them where they are unable to cause an injury.
- Tree limbs and branches should be bundled and tied, and may not exceed 5" in diameter, 5' in length, or exceed 40 pounds.

Please always carry your original Villages ID and be sure to tell your guests to always carry their valid photo ID showing their home address and Guest ID card when they are using a Villages recreation facility, even when accompanied by a resident. If they are under19 years of age, they must be accompanied by a Villages resident or a Villages guest 19 or over with a valid Guest ID card and photo ID when they are using a Villages recreation facility.

• Recreation activities end at 6:00 p.m. and the centers close at 9:00 p.m. July 4th.
