

#### Florida Enacts New Permanent Sales Tax Exemptions

The Florida Department of Revenue has enacted permanent sales and use tax exemptions on sales of items that were previously exempted temporarily during the state's past disaster preparedness and freedom month sales tax holidays.

**Effective August 1, 2025**, the following items are always exempt from Florida sales and use tax:

- Batteries (only AA, AAA, C, D, 6-volt, and 9-volt)
- Bicycle helmets (Youth bicycle helmets were previously exempt. All bicycle helmets are exempt effective August 1, 2025.)
- Carbon monoxide alarms
- Fire extinguishers
- Ground anchor systems and tie-down kits
- Insect repellent
- Life jackets
- Portable gas cans with a capacity of 5 gallons or less
- Portable generators capable of producing 10,000 running watts or less
- Smoke detection devices
- Sunscreen (excluding cosmetics or other products that are not primarily intended to absorb, reflect, or scatter ultraviolet radiation)
- Waterproof tarpaulins (flexible waterproof tarps and sheeting that are 1,000 square feet or less)

#### Wireless Access Overview for Resident Lifestyle Volunteer Groups & Rentals

The Recreation & Parks Department offers limited wireless access of devices. Customers may access the wireless service available at all recreation centers with the exception of Southside and the neighborhood centers. The use of any application of this service is for limited WiFi capability, and to assist our residents within the lobby areas, with limited service in the recreation centers.

Eligible guests may access the wireless internet if the resident is present. Residents will need Wireless laptop, Village ID card and their golf PIN number in order to access the Wireless service. ## **SOLID WASTE**

#### **BULK PICK-UP**

#### Residents of Districts 1-11

The following items can be placed in your regular household waste pick-up:

- Lamps
- Plastic Chairs
- Ceiling fans (blades must be removed)
- Brooms
- Pallets
- Carpeting and/or padding (No larger than 4' x 4' & less than 40 lbs.)

# A Bulk Item Pick-Up will need to be scheduled for larger items such as:

- Microwaves and small kitchen appliances
- Office chairs/desk chairs/kitchen chairs
- 2-burner grills
- Flat-screen TVs
- Ironing boards
- Electronics (computers, stereo equipment, monitors etc.)
- Furniture (oversized chairs, mattresses, box springs, etc.)
- Appliances (washer, dryer, dishwasher, refrigerator)
- Lawn Mowers
- Exercise Equipment
- Remodeling debris generated by the homeowner ONLY (sinks, toilets, carpeting, lumber etc.)

\*All Contractors are required to remove all debris from their jobs. This includes lawn maintenance, tree trimmers, builders, carpet installers, roofers, etc.

There will be a \$10 charge added to your utilities and amenities bill each time a bulk pick-up is requested.

### **Protect our sanitation workers**

All resident and business trash is picked up by hand. When trash isn't disposed of properly, it puts our sanitation workers at risk of injury and other hazards.



Keep our workers safe by properly bagging your trash in a tightly sealed tall kitchen bag and placing it at the end of your driveway. Additional reminders for safe disposal are below.



#### **SHARP OBJECTS**

Glass and sharp objects should be wrapped in newspaper and placed in your trash bag.

Loose glass can rip trash bags and cause cuts and scrapes on the body of you or our workers.



#### YARD WASTE

Tree limbs and brush – like sylvester palms – should be bundled and placed at the end of the driveway. The limbs may not exceed 4" in diameter and the palm fronds should face the same direction. Lawn clippings and similar yard waste must be placed in bags.

If not disposed of properly, these items pose challenges with safe handling and loading as well as equipment damage.



#### MATERIALS NOT ACCEPTED

Needles, hospital medical waste, paint, oil, lawn or pool chemicals, motor oil or tires are not accepted.

These items can cause fires, damage garbage trucks, are harmful to the environment, and may expose workers to needle stick injuries and potential infection.
