

# Golf Etiquette Around Residential Homes

- Stay mindful of your surroundings on the course. Watch where you walk, avoid disrupting other golfers, and always show respect to both players and nearby homeowners.
- When playing near homes, do not enter residential yards to retrieve balls. If your ball lands on private property, consider it out of bounds and play a new one.
- If your golf ball accidentally hits a house or property, promptly inform the homeowner and offer to cover any repair costs.
- Residential property lines are typically marked with "out-of-bounds" stakes. Playing beyond the property line of residential homes is strictly prohibited, even if not marked by out-of-bounds stakes.
- Maintain a quiet, respectful environment while playing near residential areas. Avoid loud talking, shouting, or any disruptive behavior that could disturb residents.
- Playing beyond the property line of residential homes is strictly prohibited, even if not marked by out-of-bounds stakes.
- To respect both the pace of play and nearby residents, please refrain from gathering or socializing near the 9th hole. Once your round is finished, promptly head back to the Starter Building parking area.
- Homeowners who live on a golf course understand the potential for noise and damage from errant golf balls. However, this does not excuse golfers from being reckless or inconsiderate.
