Great news, neighbors! Community Watch has an update to share about gates in some of The Villages newest areas:

- Dabney Enclave
- Dabney South
- Dabney North
- Moultrie
- Water's Edge

When neighborhoods are brand new, the gates are placed in Construction Mode. In this mode, the gates automatically open when a vehicle approaches. This setup helps keep traffic flowing smoothly, especially with the larger number of construction vehicles coming and going during development.

Because these neighborhoods are still under construction and not yet fully established, the gates will remain in Construction Mode for the time being. Once the areas are more developed, the gates will shift into full operation. At that point, drivers will need to press the red button or swipe their gate card for entry.

Be Ready: Florida Special Needs Shelters

As hurricane season continues in Florida, many residents may need to depend on shelters for safety. For those with medical or mobility needs beyond what's accommodated in a general shelter, Special Needs Shelters (SpNS) are designed to provide care during emergencies.

Who Qualifies?

SpNS are meant for residents who:

- Depend on oxygen or electric-powered medical equipment,
- Need help with mobility or daily activities,
- Have chronic health conditions or memory concerns.

Note: These shelters are a last resort. Those requiring hospital-level care should make alternate plans.

Register Early

If you may need a Special Needs Shelter, it's important to register in advance with Florida's Special Needs State Registry. Early registration helps ensure your needs are considered if an evacuation is ordered.

What to Bring

- Caregiver (must stay with you)
- Medications and medical equipment (7-10 day supply)
- Bedding, clothing, hygiene items
- Special diet foods/snacks, ID, and important documents
- Assistive devices (walker, wheelchair, glasses, hearing aids)
- Supplies for service animals (if applicable)

Take Action Now

- Register today for Florida's Special Needs Registry.
- Prepare a "Go Kit" with supplies listed above.
- Talk with your doctor or caregiver about your evacuation plan.



SAFE DISPOSAL OF KITCHEN KNIVES

Let's Keep Our Sanitation Workers Safe

Options for Safe Disposal

1. Wrap & Trash (Only if Necessary)

If you must place a knife in the trash:

- Wrap the blade in thick layers of newspaper or cardboard
- Tape securely and label clearly: "SHARP" or "CAUTION: BLADE"
- Place in a sealed, puncture-proof container (plastic bottle, coffee can, etc.)



2. Recycle as Scrap Metal

Many knives can be recycled!

Check local transfer stations or scrap yards to see if they accept household metal items.

3. Household Hazardous Waste Collection

Some counties offer HHW drop-off days where items like knives are accepted. Contact your county's solid waste department for details.

4. Donate Usable Knives

Knives in good condition may be accepted by:

- Local shelters
- Soup kitchens
- Charitable organizations like Goodwill (call ahead to confirm)

5. Retail or Manufacturer Take-Back

Some brands and retailers offer knife recycling or trade-in programs-check store policies or websites.

Protect our sanitation workers

All resident and business trash is picked up by hand. When trash isn't disposed of properly, it puts our sanitation workers at risk of injury and other hazards.



Keep our workers safe by properly bagging your trash in a tightly sealed tall kitchen bag and placing it at the end of your driveway. Additional reminders for safe disposal are below.



SHARP OBJECTS

Glass and sharp objects should be wrapped in newspaper and placed in your trash bag.

Loose glass can rip trash bags and cause cuts and scrapes on the body of you or our workers.



YARD WASTE

Tree limbs and brush – like sylvester palms – should be bundled and placed at the end of the driveway. The limbs may not exceed 4" in diameter and the palm fronds should face the same direction. Lawn clippings and similar yard waste must be placed in bags.

If not disposed of properly, these items pose challenges with safe handling and loading as well as equipment damage.



MATERIALS NOT ACCEPTED

Needles, hospital medical waste, paint, oil, lawn or pool chemicals, motor oil or tires are not accepted.

These items can cause fires, damage garbage trucks, are harmful to the environment, and may expose workers to needle stick injuries and potential infection.
