New Years Day

Districts 1-11

If you live in Village Community Development Districts 1-11 in the Sumter County, Marion County or Fruitland Park portions of The Villages, Thursday collection will be moved to Saturday, January 3rd, 2026.

District 12, 13, 14 or 15

If you live in District 12, 13, 14, or 15, Thursday collection will be moved to Saturday, January 3rd, 2026.

If you live in the Lake County portion of The Villages (not including VCDD No. 11 or 14), Thursday collection will occur on Friday. All remaining collection days for the week will be moved to the next day.

If you live in the **Town of Lady Lake** portion of The Villages, Thursday collection will be moved to Monday, January 3rd, 2026.

CHRISTMAS TREE REMOVAL

Village Community Development Districts No. 1—No. 15

If you live in Districts 1-15 in the Sumter County, Marion County or Fruitland Park portions of The Villages, discarded live Christmas trees can be placed at the curb and will be collected with your regular household trash on your designated day. The trees must follow the procedures for yard waste. Tree limbs and branches may not exceed four (4) feet in length, four (4) inches in diameter or exceed 40 pounds.

Artificial trees should be taken apart and placed curb side in sections and will be collected with your regular household trash on your designated day. If you have any questions, please contact sanitation at 352-748-0109 (Districts 1-11) and 352-750-0000 for Districts 12-15.

If you live in the **Lake County portion of The Villages** (not including District No. 11), live trees can be placed at the curb on your assigned yard waste day and must be in 4' lengths and no more than 6" in diameter. To discard artificial trees, please call Lake County Solid Waste to schedule a bulk pick up at 352-343-3776.

If you live in the **Town of Lady Lake portion of The Villages,** live and artificial trees can be placed at the curb and will be collected with your regular household trash on your designated day. If you have any questions, please contact Waste Management at 352-787-4416.






FIREWORKS are often used to mark special events and holidays. The only safe way to view fireworks is to attend a professional show. It is important to know that **fireworks are not safe in the hands of consumers**. Fireworks cause thousands of injuries each year.

A few ideas to get into the patriotic spirit, without fireworks:

- Use glow sticks, they glow in the dark and are a safe alternative to a sparkler. Fun for all ages.
- 2. Loud and proud. Noise makers are sure to make a statement. They can be found at local party supply stores or make your own.
- Outdoor movie night. Set up a screen and projector. Don't forget the bugspray!
- 4. Red, white and blue silly string...fun for all ages.
- 5. Make a patriotic craft with the family.
- 6. Throw a birthday party for the USA, and don't forget the cake.



FACTS

- More than 19,500 reported fires are started by fireworks annually.
- ! Burns account for 44% of the 9,100 injuries treated in emergency rooms seen in the month around July 4.
- ! Half of the fireworks injuries seen at emergency rooms were extremities: hand, finger, or leg. One-third were to the eye or other parts of the head.
- ! Children ages 10–14 had the highest rate of fireworks injury, with more than one-third (36%) of the victims of fireworks injuries under age 15.
- Sparklers account for roughly one-quarter of emergency room fireworks injuries.

5K Road Closures - Running of the Squares

The <u>Running of the Squares 5K</u> at Lake Sumter Landing will take place Saturday, January 10, 2026, beginning at 8:00 a.m. Please note the new race route and traffic impacts.

From 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m., Lake Sumter Landing Market Square will be closed to all vehicles, including portions of Lake Shore Drive, Old Mill Run, Canal Street, and surrounding access roads. Alternate access will be available via Buena Vista Blvd., Morse Blvd., and Old Camp Road.

Several multi-modal paths will also be closed during the race, including the path along Stillwater Trail (7:00–9:30 a.m.) and the path from Caroline Gate to Mallory Hill Country Club (duration of the race). Golf cart traffic from north of CR 466 should use CR 466, Laurel Manor, and Buena Vista Blvd. until approximately 9:30 a.m.
